SCRIPTURE AND STUDY

THE WORD IN OUR LIVES

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time “Father and Son”

Usually, we talk about the second part of the gospel. It's very comforting, promising rest to those who labor and a light burden for those who take Jesus' yoke, that is, are willing to be led by Jesus. But let's look at the first half of the passage. It almost sounds like a riddle with mysterious phrases. So what is Jesus saying?

First he talks about the Father hiding things “from the wise and the learned.” Some people think they know everything. They look down at people who have faith in Jesus as if they were simpletons. They usually say that faith is a way of hiding from reality; that only scientifically proven things are real. While people who think this way may be kind and generous, they are missing the deeper meaning of life. Jesus says that those hidden meanings are revealed to the “little ones,” those with a child-like ability to believe without proof, just because God tells them. These are the ones he talks about in the Beatitudes: “Blessed are the poor in spirit...blessed are the meek.” (Mt 5:3, 5)



If you want the kind of faith Jesus is talking about, you have to be open to it. You have to be willing to see the world through the eyes of faith. Do you expect to see Jesus in the people you will talk to today? Do you listen to the scripture readings for how they can apply to you? Are you willing to accept the frustrations of life, or the mistakes you make, as opportunities to experience God's love and/or forgiveness?

The second saying is about knowing the Father through the Son. We could know little or nothing about God by ourselves. But the love God has for us can only be known if he reveals it. The Father and Son are one God; they never act separately or hide anything from each other. But we may be hiding from God. If we have sinned and are afraid to confess it to God, we are missing a chance to experience God's love when he forgives us. Remember, Jesus did the hard part by dying for our sins.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing:
Today's Gospel

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time— Week of July 3, 2011

Step One: Listen to the Word

Hearing the Gospel re-read today, what words or phrases in the reading strike you? What image from this reading lingers in your mind?

Theme: Jesus refreshes and strengthens us for ministry.

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: When you are generous, honest, and loving, how do you know it is Jesus who helps you do that?

Question for Youth: As you grow in your ability to love and make sacrifices for others, how do you find comfort and peace in knowing Jesus Christ?

Question for Adults: As you go about your daily life, dying in love for others, how do you experience Christ giving you consolation and peace?
