With Archbishop Carlson's approval, we are pleased to offer an opportunity for a consecrated religious to speak to your parish on Sunday February 5, 2012. Thank you for your prayerful support, your service to Christ and willingness to create a culture of vocations within your parish.* It's for that reason that we are honored to have Sr. Bridget Smith, ASCJ, be with us this weekend. AN IMPORTANT INVITATION: On the last page of this bulletin, you will find a sign-up sheet inviting you to join one of our parish's Small Church Communities during this upcoming Lenten Season. Our parish began this process some seven years ago, and it has been very successful for those who have participated. Please note the Q & A format below, and please consider participating:

What is a "small church community"? It is eight to ten parishioners gathering once a week for an hour and a half in someone's home to pray an opening prayer, to read and reflect on the following Sunday's Scripture readings, and to discuss how these readings relate to our everyday lives.

What is the goal of such small church communities? Participating in such a group will help you be better prepared for the next Sunday's Mass, will give you a greater sense of parish community, and will help you to grow spiritually and develop a deeper appreciation of the Eucharist. What greater Lenten activity is there than becoming a part of a small church community?

When will these sessions begin? Running the six weeks of Lent, they will begin the week of February 20th and will end the week of March 30th, the week before Holy Week.

How might I sign up? In today's bulletin as well as next weekend's bulletin, you will find a list of the leaders and the days and times that they will be hosting a small church community in their homes. If you are interested in being part of a small church community during the season of Lent, please complete the enclosed form and either drop in the container in the vestibule of the church or mail it to the Parish Office as soon as possible. You will also be able to sign up after the Masses in our Gathering Space through **February 12 which is the deadline for signing up for a group.**
