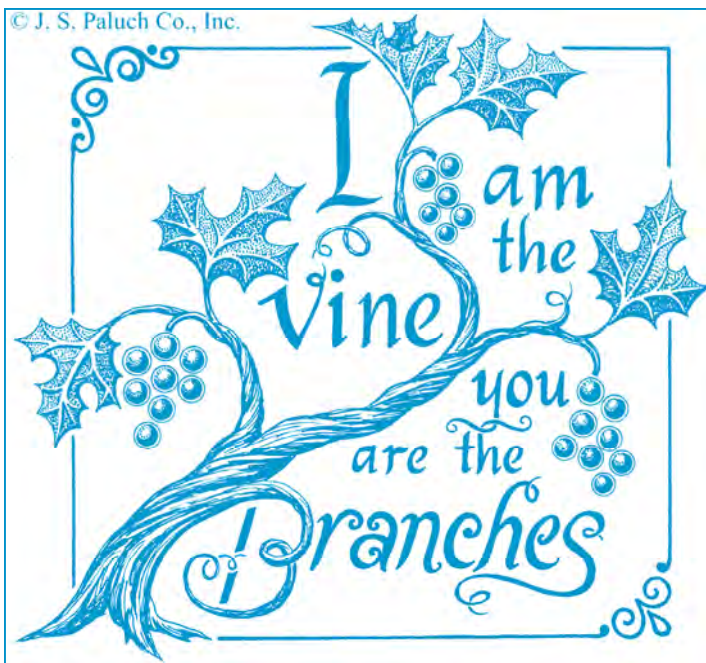

**From the Pastors Pen**

It was a big Parish Weekend. **The 150 Club** held its annual dinner Friday night. It was good to see an elegant event, so well attended. Saturday night saw the **Sports Awards Night**, and there was a lot of energy in the gym with hundreds of children and parents. Sports and scholarship awards were given out. And Tuesday was a delightful **Living Rosary and May Crowning** at school.

At Mass Sunday I continued to reflect on our Easter rebirth. Last week St. John's letter guided us to understand our identity as God's children, another birth building on our human birth. St. Peter shows his rebirth by boldly professing the name of Jesus in a threatening environment, after he'd denied Jesus out of fear days earlier during the Lord's Passion. There is much in us that can yet be reborn, whether moving from fear like Peter, or discouragement, cynicism, or vengeful anger. This weekend, we see that ministry for God's people is done only by reborn people. It's not about me, what I want, getting my way, or what has to move for me to be happy. It's about my identity as one of God's reborn children, and how I may be able to contribute to that.

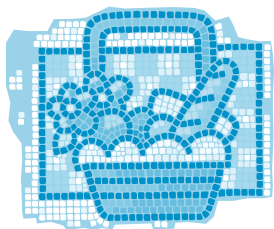

What is the Relay for Life?

The American Cancer Society's Relay for Life is a fun-filled overnight experience that creates memories. It celebrates survivors, remembers loved ones and raises money to support the mission of the American Cancer Society. As a team, "Roses Gone Wild" we will be looking to friends, family and fellow parishioners to help us raise money prior to the Relay. The day of the event, we gather with tents and sleeping gear to camp out at Hazelwood Central High School and take turns walking around the track. From 7:00PM to 7:00AM a team member must be on the track walking because "Cancer Never Sleeps".

The Relay starts at dusk and ends in the morning because the light and darkness of day parallel the experience of a cancer patient that is undergoing treatment. Sunset symbolizes the time a person gets diagnosed with cancer. As evening progresses it gets colder and darker which represent the struggles the patient goes through as they endure the emotions of being a cancer patient. From 1:00-2:00AM represents when treatment starts. They become exhausted, sick and not sure they want to go on. As participants in the Relay you have been walking and you start to feel the same way but, like the cancer patient, you know you can't give up. The time around 4:00-5:00am symbolizes the completion of treatment. Once again fatigue sets in but they know they will make it. Now the sun is rising and it represents the end of treatment. They see the light and know life will go on. The morning light brings a new day and as participants, you also know the end is close at hand. When you leave the Relay, think of the cancer patient leaving that last treatment. You are both exhausted, maybe weak, but you know there is hope in the new day.

Consider joining us or making a monetary donation to support the Team. Luminaries can be purchased in a loved one's name. **Remember: There is no finish line until a cure is found. The Relay For Life is August 3rd-4th. Please consider joining our team even if you can only walk one lap. If you have questions call Peggy at 837-3410.**
