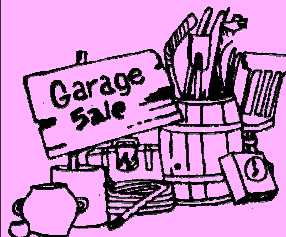

**WHAT IS
A STEPHEN MINISTER?
COULD THAT BE YOU TOO?**

Holy Spirit Stephen Ministry will train its third class of new Stephen Ministers this coming September.

For those of you unfamiliar with the program, Stephen Ministry is a care giving ministry. That statement begs the question to whom is care given, what kind of care is given, and what does it take to be a Stephen Minister?

Stephen Ministry is available at no cost to persons experiencing a crisis in their lives such as grieving the loss of a loved one, divorce, job loss, critical illness, or difficulty with a troubled child. Stephen Ministers provide distinctive Christian care to enable people to better understand and cope throughout their struggle.

This means that the Stephen Minister is a care giver acknowledging that God is the cure giver. Such care is given by being available to listen, to be compassionate, to be non-judgmental, to be trustworthy, and to bring prayer, blessing, and scriptural reflections into the relationship.

Stephen Ministers are most often "wounded healers". This means that the caregiver has experienced loss or pain and can understand some of what the care receiver is going through because of his or her experience. Stephen Ministers believe in Jesus and live in relationship with him. Stephen Ministry is one way they express their faith in and love for Jesus. Does that sound like the person you are? Is the Holy Spirit calling you to be a care giver? WHAT IS "CRHP?"

"Christ Renews His Parish," is an effective spiritual renewal process which calls together the members of the parish—priests, religious, laity— in order to experience personal conversion and Christian community in the environment of their own parish. It is the simplicity of the process, beginning with the "renewal weekend," which invokes personal rebirth in Christ and parish revitalization. CRHP allows one to experience "church"—to experience "being church"— and to experience "being church for others."
