**Membership In the Propagation of the Faith:** You will find this as the first envelope in your packet for the month of February. It usually is put in the packet during Lent but for some reason it was placed here. The reason for this envelope is that one of the practices of Lent is to give alms. In reality it makes no difference where it appears, the purpose is to make an offering to help the missions of the world. Whenever you wish to make a contribution just place the envelope in the collection basket along with your regular weekly offering. Thank you for the support of the missions.

**Priesthood Discernment Retreat:** This retreat was initiated by Cardinal Justin Rigali ten years ago. It will take place on Saturday, February 18th at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in Richmond Heights. It is offered for young men between the ages of 18-30. If interested please contact the rectory for a registration form.

**Faith Direct:** During Lent we are reminded of our call to be stewards with gifts of time, talent and treasure. At St. Elizabeth Ann Seton we appreciate your gifts, regardless of how they come. **Silent Sermon:** Someone gave this to me and I thought it worthwhile passing on to you.

Not a word had been spoken since the initial greeting. The minister glanced at his watch and chose this time to leave. He slowly stood up, picked up the cold, dead ember and placed it back in the middle of the fire. Immediately it began to glow once more, with the light and warmth of the burning coals around it.

As the minister reached the door to leave, his host said, with a tear running down his cheek, "Thank you so much for your fiery sermon. I shall be back in church next Sunday.

#### *Journeying Through Grief*

"... and Jesus wept" (John 11:36). As we know, the cause of our Lord's grief at this time was the death of his dear friend Lazarus. Even the bystanders present at the scene noted his grief: "See how he loved him." Because of our common humanity, Jesus experienced the great sadness that all of us go through over the loss of a loved one. *Journeying Through Grief* is a Christ-centered ministry new in our Parish whose purpose is to reach out to those in mourning and offer them comfort and help. This includes anyone experiencing a significant loss, whether it is the loss of a loved one, friendship, job, or home. It is based on a program of the Archdiocese of St. Louis whose Mission Statement says it best: To provide a safe and supportive experience enabling each person to begin to transform her/his life from a time of mourning to a time of healing. The Ministry will meet for four consecutive Tuesday evenings in March (March 6, 13, 20, and 27) in the Rectory Basement Meeting Room, #2 Seton Court, St. Charles, from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. It is open to anyone in mourning, regardless of when the loss occurred whether recently or in the past. The program is not limited to SEAS parishioners. Guests are welcome. 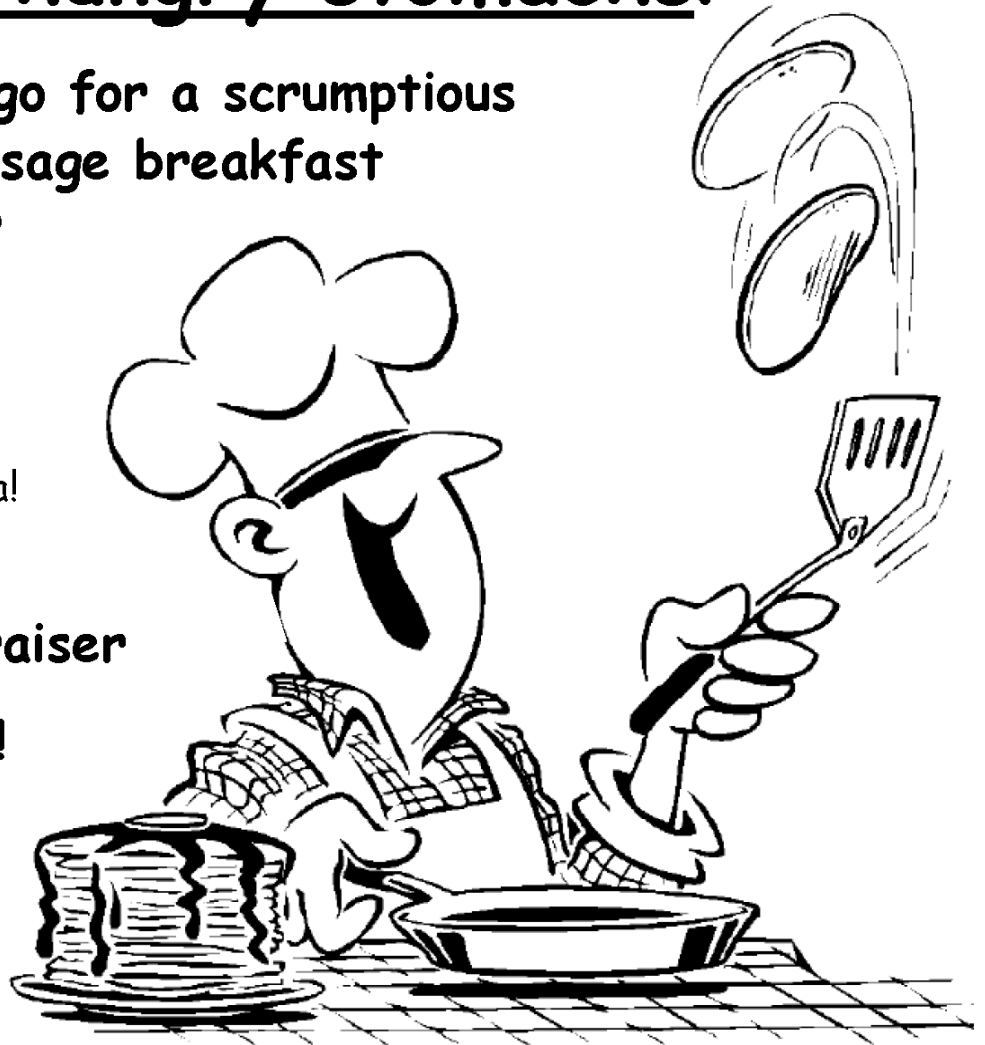
